Wheelchair wonder of Kathleen



Kathleen Bailey (29) has already had her best Christmas present . . . she has walked away from her wheelchair and can even bend down and touch

her toes.

Just over a week ago, Mrs Bailey, a mother of three who lives in Gloucester Avenue, Dawley, was confined to a wheelchair with a back problem.

Today she is out and about again after what a consultant at the Shropshire Orthopaedic Hospital at Golewen described as an incredibly dramatic recovery.

Kathleen claims it is due to the help of Irish faith healer Danny Gallagher.

"She was certainly very much better than when we last saw her," the consultant said. He added that she had said she had disc degeneration, and she had not responded to treatment in the past.

Mrs Bailey was injured at work 11 years ago.

Got worse

But it was only 18 months ago the injury — which affected discs in her spine — began to get worse.

"About 18 months ago it started playing up and in October I was put in bed and was unable to move except with a wheelchair."

Eventually Mrs Bailey went to Erdington, Birmingham, where Danny Gallagher held a clinic.

The first time she refused to stay, but after friends and relatives told her she had nothing to lose by going, she went back "just to keep the peace."

"I was virtually a cripple; I could not do anything," she said.

Now she just has a little pain, no worse than a headache, a couple of hours a day.

Mrs Bailey's husband Roger said: "She kept asking me what I wanted for Christmas and I said I wanted to see her on her feet. I have got that, I don't want anything else."
