## ULSTER faith healer Danny Gallagher has been called into action - to help US soldiers wounded in Iraq.

The Maghera miracle man visited American troops at a military field hospital in Washington DC last month.

Many of the soldiers who were flown back from war-torn Iraq were suffering from horrific life-threatening injuries.

After being invited into the high security Walter Reed Army Medical Centre by the wife of an Air Force Colonel, Danny says he was shocked at what he saw.

"It was very distressing," says Danny.

"Apparently it's the largest field hospital in America and it was completely packed with wounded soldiers.

"They were being flown in every day and some of the injuries were just terrible.

"Many soldiers had lost arms or legs in bomb attacks and many others had gun-shot wounds.

"There was a lot of distress in the hospital and I did all I could to try and comfort them and calm their mind."

Danny and his exploits are world famous.

The Co. Derry man is the seventh son of a seventh son and according to Celtic lore he therefore possesses the power to heal people simply by touching them.

His incredible power is backed by testimonies of people who have made miraculous recoveries from the most serious of illnesses after being touched by Danny.

Even doctors have recommended patients to see Danny.

Thirty years ago Danny cured a young crippled girl. The story became world famous and it changed Danny's life forever.

### Contacted

Last month Danny was invited to America to visit a family in Virginia who needed some help.

"Word spread about me and soon there were people coming from all over the Washington area to see me," says Danny.

"People with cancer, back problems and other illnesses came to see if I could help them.

"A lady called Cathleen Davis contacted me and asked if I would visit some of the soldiers who had been hurt in Iraq.

"Cathleen was the wife of an Air Force Colonel. A couple of days later I was picked up by a military escort and taken to the Walter Reed Army Medical Centre.

"I was only supposed to spend half-an-hour or so at the hospital but I ended up spending the day.

"It was very hard for me to get over just how many seriously injured soldiers there were.

"All I could do was pray with them, bless them and try and clam their a mind a bit because some of them were in a terrible state mentally.

"I was able to help quite a few of them."

One young soldier Danny met had his hands blown off by a roadside bomb attack in which six of his army colleagues were killed.

### Attack

And it turned out he had strong family links to Ireland.

"I met Corporal James E Wright while visiting the hospital the first day," says Danny.

"His mother Carmel was there and she asked me to see her son. It turned out she was from Tarbert in Co. Kerry.

"James was a bit of a war hero. He took part in the Ronald Reagan state funeral and was pictured on the front of the Washington Times.

"His case was very sad because all his friends were killed in the attack in which he lost his hands.

"I also met an army priest

called Father Henry who had a part of his head blown off in a bomb attack.

"The picture of me with him shows me covering up his wound which was terrible. He's still critically injured and I hope he will pull through.

"I saw as many soldiers as I could and they wanted me to stay with them but I wasn't able to.

"Hopefully I will be able to go back sometime next year."

In 2002 the *Sunday World* revealed how Danny helped a 56-year-old woman from Fintona walk again.

Due to a seizure Mary Mullan hadn't walked in 12 years and was wheelchair-bound, until she met Danny.

She said then: "He touched all the areas of my body that were giving me problems; my back, neck, knees and chest.

"I could feel this incredible heat coming off his hands and by the second session I was able to get out of my wheelchair and walk towards Danny.

"After the third visit I didn't need my wheelchair anymore so the miracle had come true.

"I'm not a religious person but this is the most incredible thing that has ever happened to me."
